



Naches Heights Vineyard and Winery Releases New 2006 and 2007 Varietals

SEATTLE, WA - May 13, 2008 – Naches Heights Vineyard and Winery releases their 2007 Pinot Gris and Riesling and their 2006 Syrah. Owner and operator Phil Cline with the help of his winemakers Mark Wysling and Jean Claude-Beck have handcrafted this new series that showcases their uniqueness and complexity.

Both wines are crafted dry in an Alsatian style by winemaker Mark Wysling.

In 2007, NHV produced over 600 cases of wine, including its first bottling of Syrah. Mr. Cline continues to expand his vineyard management and wine marketing business while continuing to implement environmentally sound practices throughout the vineyard and winery.

Naches Heights Vineyard is one of Washington State's highest elevated vineyards at 1780', located nine miles northwest of Yakima on the edge of the Cascade mountain range. This high elevation site produces cooler night temperatures which in turn provide high acidity and great color in the grapes.

Mr. Cline's prior experience in management of a 4000 case winery, vineyard development and management for Two Coyote Vineyards in Buena and his love of the land he lives on prompted this venture. The owner and former general manager of Yakima Cellars winery, Phil Cline has released his first vintage from his own Naches Heights Vineyard a 2005 Pinot Gris and Riesling.
